



Woodhaven Neighborhood Initiatives Updates

District 5

Overview

The Woodhaven neighborhood is coordinating with City of Fort Worth departments to explore new projects and address maintenance needs. Below is a concise summary of current requests and departmental responses.

New Projects Under Review

1. High Woods Trail Sidewalks
 - Safety-driven request for new sidewalks; no impact to private yards.
 - Ranked 922–3127 out of 7,000 sidewalk gaps in the City’s Active Transportation Plan (ATP).
 - Significant engineering challenges (signal poles, wiring, retaining walls, tree protections).

Status: Placed on future bond sidewalk list; pending funding.
2. High Woods Trail Traffic Calming
 - Address speeding and safety concerns.
 - Collector street classification makes it ineligible for the calming program.

Status: FWPD enforcement recommended.
3. Crossings & Connectivity
 - Request for crosswalks connecting High Woods Trail to Riverbend/Quanah Park.

Status: Will be installed only when sidewalks/ADA ramps are built; included in future bond sidewalk list.
4. Country Club Lane Sidewalk Extension
 - Extension requested northbound on both sides.
 - Ranked 2757 of 7,000 ATP gaps; utility relocations required.

Status: Added to future bond sidewalk list.
5. Oakmont Lane Sidewalks
 - New installation request.

- Ranked 2516–3767 of 7,000 gaps; utilities, retaining walls, and tree removals required.

Status: Added to future bond sidewalk list.

6. Recreation & Parks Improvements

- Exploring park, playground, pool, and recreation amenities.
- Parks Department owns 3 acres on Woodhaven Blvd planned for future development (playground, pavilion, hard court).

Status: Additional location details requested regarding “back 9” near High Woods Trail; clarification needed.

7. Infrastructure Improvements

- Pump repair for irrigation water—from Trinity River to golf course—located on private property.
- Internet/cellular reliability improvements discussed between AT&T and District Director.

Status: Ongoing coordination.

Maintenance Actions Needed

Residents should submit issues through the MyFW App first; these can then be escalated through City Council.

1. Country Club & Boca Raton Traffic Light

Status: TPW requests written confirmation to begin a new investigation (up to 90 business days).

2. Oakmont Lane Pavement Issues

Status: TPW needs block number clarification.

3. 924 Country Club Lane Sidewalk Repair

Status: Determined to be homeowner responsibility per City Code.

4. End O Trail Drainage Issue

Status: TPW requests block number clarification.

5. Boca Raton & Bridgewood Traffic Signal

Status: Full signal not warranted; staff will continue monitoring.

6. Trash & Litter Control

Status: Report through MyFW App or call 817-392-1234; serviced via Upspire.

7. Public Trash Can Maintenance

Status: Report through MyFW App or call 817-392-1234; serviced via Upspire.
