Hi Erika:

Your document request is extremely broad, a conspiracy in search of any basis in fact whatsoever. Most of your requests are illegitimate demands on a nonprofit you have no role in, or questions about my communications that have nothing to do with my role as President of the Woodhaven Neighborhood Association. You are not entitled to records just by virtue of the fact that they concern developments in the neighborhood. Notably, you are not entitled to demand records from WNA under the open records law as we are not a government entity. Nonetheless, under the Texas property code, you may be entitled to certain records, which we have provided online and in the attached ZIP folder. I also included several communications between me and other stakeholders even if you are not entitled to them, simply to give you some insight into the work we are doing that you seem so keen on opposing though they have broad public support from neighbors, universities, and elected officials here. WNA Exec is committed to representing the best interests of the neighborhood and has done so consistently and transparently. If you are keen on holding anyone accountable it should be city officials who have all the power over the fate of our neighborhood but have neglected our needs for decades. If you are interested in helping us do our jobs, we welcome your input, but enough with the baseless contrarian opposition when there is no feasible alternative.

My relationship with Econautics and the fact that Econautics is a tenant on Tract G working with the developer on our mission in Woodhaven has been disclosed in every single public meeting we have hosted, and was the basis for my inclusion in the Woodhaven Conservation Advisory Board that authored the Revised Master Plan, and one of the reasons I was successful in my campaign to lead WNA. I give an update on Econautics' activities in the neighborhood at every meeting we have, including several you have not attended. And to be clear, the fact that I founded Econautics.org and am working on Tract G was disclosed in my written profile and circulated to the entire membership prior to being elected to serve as the President of the Woodhaven Neighborhood Association.

My authority to serve in this role and to advocate on behalf of the WNA to city officials on specific issues is clearly provided by our bylaws and by the election results. The WNA members also voted on whether to support the rezoning prior to my election and this was decided by an overwhelming majority in support of the new plan for the neighborhood. Those election results and the bylaws are included in the responsive documents.

The plans I support, which to be clear are conceptual at this stage and undergoing feedback from the neighborhood via survey and town halls, as well as to elected officials and city staff, are also clearly supported by the Woodhaven Master Plan, which was a painstaking process involving months of public feedback. The plans I

support are also legally in line with the rezoning which was unanimously approved by the Fort Worth City Council and the Zoning Commission and passed the Planning Commission on a 5 – 2 majority vote. That was the meeting when you announced to city officials and your neighbors that if the plan were approved, you would sell your home and relocate. Instead of keeping your word, you misled city officials and all of us, and have doubled down on your efforts to stymie development in Woodhaven and have since run unsuccessfully for President of the Woodhaven Neighborhood Association and when you lost that election to me. I understand you have since attempted to start your own neighborhood association, allegedly to provide transparency and advocate for your neighbors. The real question is, by what authority do you operate? Every democratic process we have gone through militates against your campaign to undermine development in a district that sorely needs it.
